

Will of Ann W. English.

In the name of god Amen I, Ann W. English  
of the Township of Egg Harbor in the County of Atlantic  
and state of New Jersey being of sound mind mem-  
ory and understanding for which blessing I thank  
god I do make and publish this my last will  
and testament in the manner following that is to say

Item first I give and bequeath unto my daughter  
Emeline Lee a certin piece of wood land  
situated in the township of Egg Harbor County and  
state aforesaid containing about four acres more  
or less on the west side of the road leading from  
Scullville to free town adjoining lands of  
Elva Smith and Margaret Lee.

Item second I also give and bequeath unto  
my daughter Emilee Littlepage and my son  
Christopher L. English a certin piece of wood-  
land to be equally divided between them  
situated in the township of Egg Harbor County  
and state aforesaid containing about six acres  
being the same more or less on the west side of the  
road leading from Scullville to free town adjoin-  
ing lands of Cnoch B. Champion and Elva  
Smith.

Item third I also give and bequeath unto  
my son Christopher L. English my best feather bed  
straw bed bolster and pillows and one  
counterpane and bedsted

Item fourth I also give and bequeath unto  
my daughter Emeline Lee one bed which I  
receive from my father.

Item fifth I also give and bequeath unto  
my daughter Emilee Littlepage one bed which I  
receive from my father.

Item six I also give and bequeath all  
my bedding unto my three children namely  
Emeline Lee Emilee Littlepage and Christopher  
L. English to be equal divided among them

Item seventh also give and bequeath  
unto my three children all of my dishes to be  
equal divided among them namely Emeline  
Lee Emilee Littlepage and Christopher English

Item eight I also give and bequeath  
unto my grandson Joseph English one cow.

Item ninth if there should be any  
money at my death it is my will for it to be  
equally divided among my three children namely

W. W. English

Emeline Lee Enrice Littlepage and Christopher L. English.

Lastly I hereby appoint my beloved son Christopher L. English executor of this my last will and testament.
