The organization will assume the mission and absorb the personnel and facilities of Detachment 1, 67th Reconnaissance Technical Squadron to provide Headquarters PACAF with an immediate photo intelligence response capability.

The 548th TRS will provide photographic and intelligence support for the Directorate of Intelligence, PACAF in the form of special intelligence reports, photo interpretation reports, photo intelligence reports, briefing ads, annotated photo enlargements, contact prints and other photographic intelligence materials.

Beginning with a nucleus of personnel from the 67th Reconnaissance Technical Squadron, Yokota AB, Japan, the detachment will number approximately 128 men by October 1965.

Clifford, the unit is currently located in the Atomic Energy Commission trailer area and will soon be relocated in the former Lockheed facility near Honolulu International Airport. Plans call for a permanent home for the 548th RTS to be constructed at Hickam in 1967 and expansion to a force of over 400 personnel.
