INTRODUCTION.

Isaae, of Middletown, Conn., who was a saddler by trade, but followed the seas; became an Orderly Sergeant in the war of the Revolution, but settled subsequently in the town of Wells, Vt., and known very extensively as Master Andrews, from his employment as teacher. He removed to Central N. Y., where he followed surveying, and died over 80 years of age. This Isaac is said to be a son of Thomas, of Middletown, who had brothers Samuel and Ithamar, all of whom were sons of John of Hartford, a member of the first Ch. there, and was eldest son of Mr. Wm. Andrews, the "School Master." This Ithamar, son of John, was Bap. in Hartford 7 Jan., 1727, and married Hannah Cadwell 31 March, 1757, and both owned the Cov. 22d Jan, 1758, at Hartford. Rev. Emerson Andrews, an Evangelist of the Baptist order, whose home is at Westmoreland, N. H., is a son of James, who was the youngest son of Joseph, who was son of Isaac, from Eng., but located in Norton, Mass., as a farmer. The brothers of James were Joseph, John, and Nathan. In 1755, near the mouth of the St. Lawrence River, two English ships, one the Dunkirk, under Capt. Howe, the other the Defiance, under Capt. Andrews, took two French men-of-war, the Aleide and Lys, loaded with troops and ammunitions of war.

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Ebenezer Andrews, Jun., son of Ebenezer, førmerly of Greensfarms, Fairfield Co., Conn., but removed to Mil.un, Ohio, trace back their lineage to John of Greensfarms, who was son of Francis Andrews, early in Hartford, and subsequently to Fairfield, where he made his will and died. The above Ebenezer, Jun., was a graduate of Yale College about 1861. Thomas Andrews of Greensfarms, m. Abigail Nash. From town reeords of Fairfield, Conn., John Andrews, the son of John Andrews, was horn 24 Oct., 1679: Sarah, of John, horn 12 Jun., 1680.

the "long lot" to their brother Ebenezer. All these snpposed to be the descendants of Francis of Hartford and Fairfield.

Prof. N. Lloyd Andrews of Madison University, Hamilton, N. Y., professor of Greek language and literature in that institution, m. Cynthia S. Burchard of Eaton, N. Y., 6 Sept., 1865; he is third son of Nath'l of Fabius, N. Y., and his wife, Catharine G. Remsen, now, 1871, of Newark, N. J. This Nathanael was son of Philarmon of Haddam, Conn., who was son of Zephaniah, of Haddam, Coan., who was the fourteenth child of Samuel of the same town, and his wife Eleanor Lee. This Samuel died 14 Dec., 1758, in East Haddam. He is supposed to be son of Thomas, of Middletown, who was son of Mr. Wm., the school-master at Hartford, Conn., 1639. This Haddam family is quite numerous, and well might be, for Samuel the settler there, by his first wife Eleanor Lee, had 1st, Samuel, b. 28 Sep., 1709; 2, Mary, b. 24 Dec., 1710; 3, Richard, b. 14 Jan. 1711-12; 4, Eleanor, b. 12 March, 1713; 5, Hannah, b. 18 July, 1714; 6, Sarah, b. 13 Feb., 1715-16; 7, Elizabeth, b. 15 April, 1717; 8, Ezra, b. 24 Oct., 1718; 9, Thos, b. 3 March, 1720; 10, Nehemiah, b. 18 May, 1722; 11, Abigail, b. 5 Aug, 1723; 12, Mehitabel, b. 11 May, 1724; 13, Susannah, b. 11 Oct., 1726; 14, Zephaniah, b. 9 May, 1728; 15, Ebenezer, b. 3 May, 1730; 16, Rachel, b. 17 Aug., 1732; thus one wife was the mother of sixteen children in twenty-one years. They were both members of the Ch. in East Haddam, and had all these children baptized in 1725, when the mother joined the Ch., except the four last born, and these soon after birth. The mother died (date not known), when 2d he married 1st June, 1736, Mrs. Mary Holmes, widow of Capt. John Holmes of East Haddam. Marquis Lyman Andrews, Esq., a Judge in "Little Rock," Ark., is a descendant of this Haddam race; is a son of Daniel G. Andrews, living at New London, Iowa, and his wife Mary Ann Andrews, da. of Marquis, so his parents were both Andrews and of the Haddam family, but very remotely related.

Philemon, of East Haddam, (called on the old record Philarmon,) removed to Chataqua Co., N. Y.; had children Salmon, Gordon, Erastas, Nathaniel, Wilson, Dudley, Phelinda, Sally. This Gordon removed to Waterbury : had children, 1, Joseph, 2, Henry R., (who resides in Waterbury and is a stone cutter, m. 18 July, 1840, Lucinda M. Brooks of Haddam, and had a son Wm. Henry born 10 Nov., 1847,) 3, Charles P., 4, Ursula S., 5, Lucy, 6, Lovena, 7, Harriet M., 8, John S., 9, Eliza. Timothy Fuller Andrews, of East Haddam, m. Rhoda Spencer, da. of Solomon; they had children, viz: 1, Timothy Fuller, 2, Lee Deming, 3, Geo. Lisnor, 4, Wells Chapman, 5, Gordon Spencer, (born 17 June, 1809, m. 17 Nov., 1844, Catharine Deming of New Britain, a grand-daughter of Col. Isaac Lee,) 6, Harriet, 7, Jennett Mason, 8, Eunice Chapman, 9, David Chapman. This Gordon Spencer Andrews above resides in Wa-
